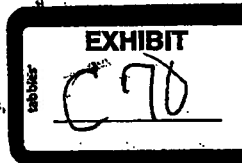
FRANK W. DAWKINS

of the full age of majority and domiciled in Lafayette Parish, who, after being duly sworn, deposed and said:

He is a practicing attorney in the State of Louisiana. In his capacity as an attorney, he represented Wilfred Bell in the matter entitled Interdiction of Wilfred Bell on the docket of the Fifteenth Judicial District Court and bearing Docket Number 76430-F in Vermilion Parish, Louisiana, at the request of Sue Bell since he was familiar with Mr. Bell's health status, as he had been representing Mr. Bell since September, 1996.

He personally appeared at the Interdiction proceeding, as the attorney for Wilfred Bell. Wilfred Bell was nearby and available for interview by the Judge if necessary. Frank Dawkins waived service for Wilfred Bell since the Interdiction proceeding was really not adversary, as I felt that given Mr. Bell's health status, both mental and physical, interdiction was in his best interest, so that someone competent could take care of his affairs and also to prevent Mr. Bell from being subject to being re-deposed in the civil litigation pending against him. Frank Dawkins's participation in the Interdiction proceedings were clearly voluntary. Wilfred Bell raised no objections to the proceedings, Frank Dawkins' representation, nor the rendition of Judgment.

These facts are testified to by Frank Dawkins of his own personal knowledge.

3.



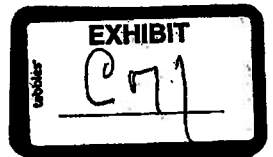



BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public duly commissioned and qualified, personally came and appeared LOVENIA B. MULL of the full age of majority and domiciled in Metairie, Louisiana who, being by me duly sworn, did depose and say as follows:

Wilfred Bell disclosed to her that he had knowledge of the interdiction proceeding at the time of the interdiction proceedings. Wilfred Bell was acutely aware and had no objections to the interdiction. Wilfred Bell voluntarily acquiesced in the interdiction judgement and was present in the parish the judgement was executed.

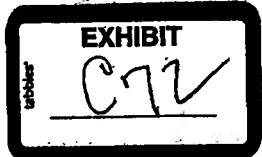
She had knowledge that all parties were present at the Vermilion Parish Courthouse and no one objected to the proceeding individually or through their attorney. Parties being: Wilfred Bell, Wilfred Bell's attorney Frank Dawkins, Sue Bell, and Sue Bell's attorney Jim Bullen.

Lovenia B. Mull was appointed Undercuratrix during the interdiction proceeding. The judgement of interdiction was entered on the 19th day of June 2001, was executed and has continuously been executed from the day it was rendered through the current date. Wilfred Bell never took any action to enjoin the interdiction and never requested that she stop the execution or enforcement of the judgement.

Lovenia B. Mull had Wilfred Bell's Social Security income of \$551.00 per month changed to her name at the time she was appointed Curatrix on March 22, 2002 and has since taken care of all of Wilfred Bell's personal and medical needs. Wilfred Bell had knowledge that the social security funds were no longer in his name and that the funds were being used to care for his personal and medical needs.

AFFIDAVIT

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, personally came and appeared SUE BELL, of the full age of majority and domiciled in Lafayette Parish, State of Louisiana, who, after being duly sworn, did depose and say.

All parties involved in the interdiction of Wilfred Bell were in fact present at the Vermilion Parish Courthouse during the interdiction proceedings. The parties were: Wilfred Bell, present and awaiting an interview at Judge Hebert's discretion, Wilfred Bell's attorney of six years, Frank Dawkins, Sue Bell, Wilfred Bell's daughter, and her attorney Jim Bullen.

There were no objections from any party present, individually or through their attorney of record, to the interdiction proceedings or judgement of interdiction.

All parties participated in the interdiction, either individually or through their attorney of record. Wilfred Bell desired the interdiction judgement. All parties had knowledge of the circumstances that gave rise to the interdiction.

The judgement of interdiction that was entered on the 19th day June 2001, was executed in the Parish while the interdict was present and has continuously been executed from the day it was rendered through the current date with full knowledge of Wilfred Bell. Apparer was appointed Curatrix on June 19, 2001 and from the date of the interdiction had Wilfred Bell's Social Security income of approximately \$550.00 monthly changed to her name to manage all of Wilfred Bell's personal and medical affairs until Lovenia B. Mull was appointed Curatrix on March 22, 2002. Wilfred Bell was aware he no longer had the social security funds available to him. The social security income was managed to care for his personal and medical needs.

Wilfred Bell voluntarily acquiesced in the judgement and was present in the Parish where the judgement was executed. Wilfred Bell knew the time and place of the interdiction proceeding, and the purpose of the proceeding. He was acutely aware that the judgement was being executed and has not ever attempted to enjoin enforcement of the judgement.

Only recently, on the 6th day of January 2003 has Roy Bell attempted to annul the judgement.

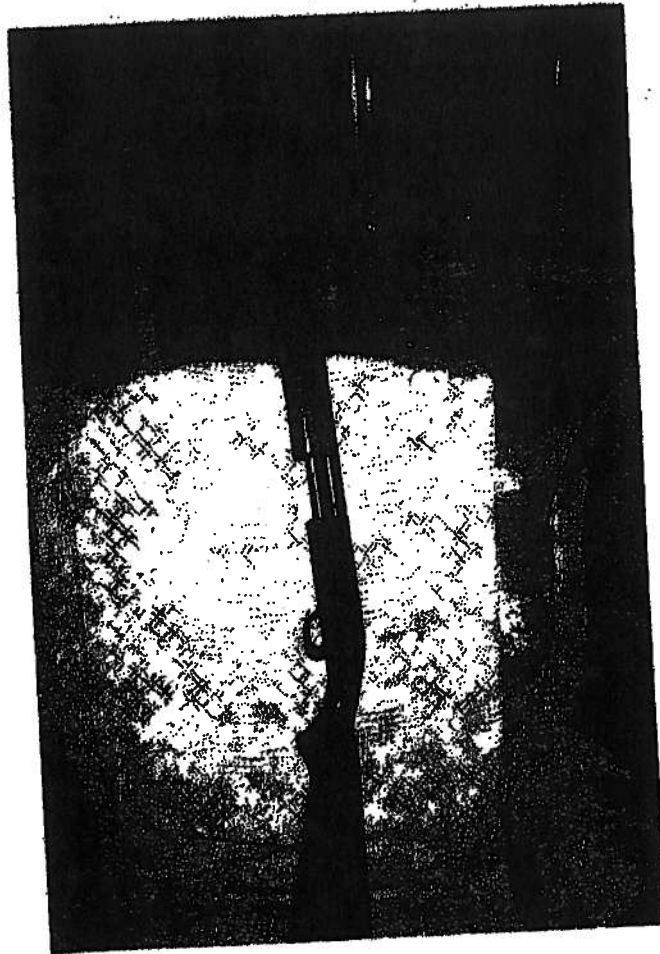

CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

To: W. Bell

Under the provisions of Article 897 of the Criminal Code of Procedure, imposition of execution of sentence of 1 year, C.C. on ex. c. v. s. but 6 mo. has been suspended, and you have been placed on probation for a period of five (5) years on September 14, 1998 by the Honorable Edward Rubin Judge sitting in and for the court at Abbeville, Louisiana. It is the Order of the Court that you shall comply with the following general and special conditions of probation.

- 1. Refrain from criminal conduct, specifically the violation of any State, Federal, Local or Municipal Law.
- 2. Support your legal dependents to the best of your ability.
- 3. Report to your Probation Officer as directed.
- 4. Permit the Probation Officer to visit you at home or elsewhere.
- 5. Devote yourself to an occupation approved by your Probation Officer.
- 6. Refrain from owning or possessing firearms or other dangerous weapons.
- 7. Make reasonable reparation or restitution to the aggrieved party for damage or loss caused by your offense in an amount determined by court, if any, as follows:

- 8. Refrain from frequenting unlawful or disreputable places or consorting with disreputable persons.
- 9. Remain within the jurisdiction of the Court and get the permission of the Probation Officer before any change in your address or employment.
- 10. Make a full and truthful report at the end of each month to your Probation Officer, whose address is:

11. Special Conditions are as follows:

(2) The six months sentence on each count is to run concurrent with each other and may be served by home detention without electronic monitoring, and shall run concurrently and coterminously with the federal home detention currently being served by defendant.

(3) Pay \$1,000.00 fine on each count for a total fine of \$5,000.00 to be paid by September 14, 1999.

(5) Refrain from any contact with any juvenile female under the age of 18 to whom defendant is not related unless said minor female's parent or guardian is present, and

(6) Shall comply as a condition of probation with the sex offender registration status, LA R.S. 15:540 et. seq., and in particular the requirements of R.S. 15:542.

12. That I hereby do waive jurisdiction of the State of Louisiana from any jurisdiction in or outside the United States where I may be found and also agree that I will not contest any effort by any jurisdiction to return me to the State of Louisiana.

13. Pay a probation supervision fee of \$20.00 per month beginning November 1, 1998.

Failure to comply with the foregoing conditions may cause your probation to be revoked. During the period of probation, you shall be subject to arrest at any time by the Probation & Parole Officer, either with or without a warrant, for the purpose of returning you to the court for further disposition.

I understand all of the above conditions which have been read to me and I solemnly promise to obey them.
