

1 Q. Right.

2 A. -- and I couldn't believe it.

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. And, they never -- I do not recall them ever offering to
5 give me copies of any of the accounting. I mean, look how long
6 it took to get this.

7 Q. All right.

8 A. It was after we filed suit.

9 Q. But, isn't it true, Mr. Marcantel, that Sue had several
10 boxes of records there that day? Do you dispute that? X

11 A. No, I can't dispute -- it seems like there were -- I mean,
12 we were in a lawyer's office. I don't know, I mean --

13 Q. Isn't it true that they offered to show you the originals
14 of any records that you wanted to see on any income or expense
15 item, and you thought it was too voluminous, you didn't want
16 that, you wanted copies to take to your office? X

17 A. That's probably what went down, I guess. She -- yes. X

18 Q. After that meeting, Mr. Gauthier sent you the letter
19 marked as 6-I, which says that he can find no authority that
20 the Trust is required to make copies of all of those boxes of
21 records, but that they would copy the ledgers for you and they
22 would certainly let you inspect any records you wanted to
23 inspect. And, he sent you that letter, isn't that correct? X

24 A. He sent me that letter. I think that letter was after our
25 meeting. X
